**Isaac Barefoot RUNYAN** was born about 1750 in New Jersey?. He died about 1867. The following article appeared in "The Reporter and Watchtower", Talladega, Alabama, Wednesday, 16 April 1879;

Isaac Runyan, Sr., who resided in the neighborhood of Alpine many years since, and afterwards, on lands now owned by Esquire Henry Sims in Castebeat, died at the age of 117... Mr. Runyan could walk about with a staff until he was 110 years old...

Isaac Barefoot RUNYAN was married to Margaret RAMBO on May 19, 1777 in Rockingham County, Virginia. **Margaret RAMBO** died about 1802 in Sevier County, Tennessee. Isaac Barefoot RUNYAN and Margaret RAMBO had the following children:

I. **John Wesley RUNYAN**<sup>1</sup> was born about 1778 in Shenandoah Valley, Virginia. He died on November 23, 1851 in Hamilton County, Tennessee. He was buried in Corinth Cemetery, Meigs County, Tennessee.

John Wesley RUNYAN was married to Nancy MULLENDORE (daughter of Abraham MULLENDORE and Susannah LAYMAN) in November 1802. **Nancy MULLENDORE**<sup>1,2</sup> was born about 1786. She died on August 10, 1874 in Meigs County, Tennessee.<sup>3</sup> "Descendants of Isaac Barefoot Runyan" by Marie Runyan Wright say's Nancy died 27 Aug 1875 in Hamilton County, however, I (David Allen Witt) have visited her grave and her headstone says she died 10 Aug 1874. The cemetery is located at the intersection of Meig, Bradley, and Hamilton counties. She was buried in Corinth Cemetery, Meigs County, Tennessee. Corinth cemetery is located on the north side of the old Ada Wrinkle farm, west of No Pone Valley Road and about 2 ½ miles north of Mt Zion Church. The church site was between the spring and cemetery and is found only with a guide. Only a few graves are marked, one of which is Nancy Runyan's. John Wesley RUNYAN and Nancy MULLENDORE had the following children:

A. **William RUNYAN**<sup>1</sup> was born on August 31, 1804 in Sevier County, Tennessee. He died on June 19, 1865 in Hamilton County, Tennessee.

William RUNYAN was married to Malinda MUREY in 1825. Malinda MUREY was born on February 8, 1805 in North Carolina. She died on June 19, 1881 in Strawberry, Lawrence County, Arkansas. She was buried in Ruben Wilmuth Farm, Strawberry, Arkansas.

B. **Tavenor RUNYAN**<sup>1</sup> was born on January 27, 1810 in Sevier County, Tennessee. He died in 1849 in Meigs County, Tennessee.

Tayenor RUNYAN was married to Jane TILERY on January 8, 1833 in Rhea County, Tennessee.<sup>1</sup>

C. Claibourn Juda RUNYAN<sup>1</sup> was born on November 17, 1813 in Tennessee. She died in 1864. He went by Juda.

Claibourn Juda RUNYAN was married to K. H. BLEDSOE on August 20, 1829 in Rhea County, Tennessee.<sup>1</sup>

D. **John W. RUNYAN**<sup>1</sup> was born on January 27, 1816 in Bledsoe County, Tennessee.

John W. RUNYAN was married to Lorinda LEWIS on August 23, 1835.1

E. Susan RUNYAN<sup>1</sup> was born on November 11, 1818 in Bledsoe County, Tennessee.

Susan RUNYAN was married to Peter NEIL on October 7, 1835 in Rhea County, Tennessee.<sup>1</sup> **Peter NEIL**<sup>1</sup> was born on November 11, 1812.

F. **Simeon P. RUNYAN Sr.**<sup>1,2,4</sup> was born on June 25, 1821. He died on June 16, 1894.<sup>5</sup> Simeon P. Runyan, a prosperous farmer of the Fourth District of James County, was born in Bledsoe County, June 26, 1821. He is the sixth of nine children of John and Nancy (Mullendore) Runyan. The parents were natives of Sevier County, Tenn., of Welsh and German descent. The father was born about 1778, and died in Hamilton (now James) County in 1854. He was a successful farmer and stanch Democrat. The mother was born in 1794, and died at the home of our subject, August 27, 1875, in her eighty-first year. They were married in their native county, and spent their lives in Sevier, Rhea and Bledsoe Counties, East Tenn. Our subject received a liberal education. He taught school several

years, in connection with his farming interests. At twenty-two or twenty-three years of age he purchased and settled on a farm in Hamilton (now James) County. He lived there fourteen years. In 1858 he moved to his present place of residence. He served one year in the war with the Cherokee Indians, in Col. Powell's Regiment. He was quartermaster sergeant of the Fifth Tennessee Regiment, Mounted Infantry, Federal Army, for one year, during the late civil war. He is a Republican and a worthy citizen. By his own efforts and judicious management has become the possessor of upward of 1,000 acres of valuable land. July 22, 1844, he married Miss Nancy C. Birgar, who was born in Roane County about 1825, and died September 4, 1860. She was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church (North), and mother of five sons and three daughters, of whom two sons and one daughter are dead. One son, recruited in the Federal Army, was in battle before he was mustered into service, and no particular account of him was given in the battle of Knoxville . February 8, 1871, our subject wedded Mrs. Susan J. Ezell, born in McMinn County in 1846. To this union one son and two daughters have been born. Mr. and Mrs. Runyan are members of the Methodist Church . After his brother, Tavenor, Sr.'s death, Simeon P. was appointed guardian of the deceased's children.

I (David Allen Witt) visited her grave, located on the Shelly Farm near Georgetown, Tn, on 5 Nov 1988; the headstone was laying face up and was weathered but legible. Simeon P. RUNYAN Sr. and Nancy Caroline BARGER had the following children:

a. **Caroline "Callie" BROOKS**<sup>9,10,11,12</sup> was born about 1867. She died about September 1899 in Georgetown, Hamilton County, Tennessee.<sup>13</sup> She had red hair and went by the nickname "Callie."

Caroline "Callie" BROOKS was married to William Hopkins WITT (son of Captain Joseph N. WITT and Mary Isabel WHITMORE) about 1889. **William Hopkins WITT**<sup>14,15,16,17,18,19,20,21</sup> was born on January 29, 1860 in Georgetown, Hamilton County, Tennessee. He died on October 31, 1938 in Kennewick, Benton County, Washington.<sup>20</sup>

A newspaper local to Kennewick, Washington, November 1938: PIONEER FARMER DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS AT HOME - W.H. Witt, Kennewick pioneer for the past 32 years, passed away at his home in the valley Monday morning following a several months' illness. William Hopkins Witt was born January 29, 1860 at Georgetown, Tennessee. On Jan 8, 1902, he was married to Hattie M. Crowe at Georgetown and in 1906 he came to Kennewick, where he has made his home since that time. He is survived by his widow, Hattie M. Witt; three sons, W.T. Witt, Reseda, California; Owen Witt, Georgetown, Tennessee and Natt Witt, Kennewick; four daughters, Mrs. L.E. Stuart, Gladstone, Oregan; Mrs. Glen Mitchell, Ellensburg; Miss Isabel Witt, Seattle; and Mrs. Myron Davis, Walla Walla. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. W.W.Beard, Chattanooga, Tennessee. Funeral services were conducted at the funeral chapel by Rev. R.B. Holden Tuesday afternoon. The Masonic lodge of which order Mr. Witt had been a member for more than 50 years, had charge of the services at the cemetery. Interment was made in the Riverview Heights cemetery.

He was buried on November 1, 1938 in Riverview Heights Cemetery, Kennewick, Washington. He went by Bill. Occupations include school teacher, farmer and postmaster.

A letter from Willette to her brother Owen notifying him of their fathers death:

Gladstone, Ore

Nov. 15, 1938

Dear Brother Owen:

I should have written you two weeks ago I told Mama I would, but I have been so busy seems like I don't get time to write. I guess you know Dad had been sick for over two years didn't you? Well in July he went

to bed and was in bed 17 weeks. Oct 31, he passed away. I don't believe he suffered very much and he knew us all most of the time up till the very last. We knew of course that he could never get well so I think we were all glad when death released him. I feel so lost tho sometimes when I think of him being gone. I think he was the very grandest and best man that ever lived, he didn't drink or swear and he was always kind and just. I wish you could have known him, he has always been my ideal and I know my life has been better by trying to live up to his principals. Mama & Natt are alone on the place now, we all felt so sorry for her she looked so forlorn, but Natt is a good boy and I think she will get over it quicker by having someone to keep house for someone to need her. She certainly was good to Dad while he was sick I am sure no hospital ever gave beter care than he got and he seemed so happy & content to be home. I went up Sat. night before he died Mon. He knew me and was so glad I came.

There was such a large crowd at the funeral and just banks of flowers. There was a church service at the funeral home and Masonic services at the grave.

Write to me Owen won't you and tell me about yourself. I had a nice trip to California this summer, my oldest girl lives in San Diego and Timmons is near Los Angeles.

Vivian & Ruth live in Spokane, Vivian is married & has a good man and two nice boys. Ruth works but makes her home with Vivian. At home I have Bill who is 17, Helen 14, Carolyn 12, Bill is last year H. S. and works part time at the electric Co. Helen is 1st year H. S. Carolyn 7th grade.

Well I guess thats all I can think of now. Be sure & write me.

Love to all from Your sister Willette Caroline "Callie" BROOKS and William Hopkins WITT had the following children:

Notes from Linnie Alma Witt as given to her son, Harold in 1989: Linnie remembers certain details of their trip from Tennessee, seeing their first train in Chattanooga, changing trains in either St. Louis or Kansas City (not sure which), possibly changed more than once. She believes this was Jan or Feb of 1905. At the large ranch house near Harrington (about 50 miles west of Spokane) she and her siblings and all the cousins had a merry time. By now there were four of the Witt clan here: William Hopkins Witt, George M. Witt, Natt Witt and their sister May Witt Anderson and husband Nick. Linnie saw the first flush toilet at the home of her Uncle George, Aunt Alma & their daughter Maida.

In 1909 Wm H. Witt and his brother-in-law, Nick Anderson, bought approximately 20 acres each, adjoining tracts, of good farmland about 3 miles southwest of Kennewick, Wa. They raised asparagus and strawberries for the market, alfalfa hay for the cows and horses, and Wm H. Witt kept bees for honey. As money and time permitted they started planting apple trees, finally reaching ten acres in Red Delicious apples. W.H. was apparently a very good and resourceful farmer and added many improvements to both house and farm. He was very much opposed to alcohol and card-playing, but did smoke a pipe after meals.

VI. **Loami RUNYAN**<sup>1</sup> was born about 1802 in Sevier County, Tennessee. It is said that John Wesley Runyan asked his mother how she felt after giving birth; her response was "low am I Wesley," thus the name Loami Wesley Runyan.

Loami RUNYAN was married to Nancy WHITE on June 30, 1843. 2nd marriage for Loami.
